97-16 Concerned White Citizens of Alabama (CWCA) Records, 1965-1968

The Concerned White Citizens of Alabama organized in 1965 as an off-shoot of the Alabama Council on Human Relations (ACHR). At a February 1965 ACHR meeting in Birmingham, Hosea Williams, a member of the staff of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) and an organizer of the Selma to Montgomery march, encouraged ACHR members to organize an "all-white" demonstration in Selma in support of the Voting Rights March. Those individuals organized a separate group, which they called the Concerned White Citizens of Alabama (CWCA). Many members of CWCA were also members of the Unitarian Church in Birmingham.

Jeff Drew, son of movement activists John and Deenie Drew, knew Martin King when King stayed in his parents' home in Birmingham during movement events of the early 1960s. The Drows owned and operated Alexander Insurance Agency in Birmingham. Dr. King, whom Drew referred to as "Uncle Mike," inscribed Drew's copy of *THE MEASURE OF A MAN* published in 1969. The book is also inscribed by Rev. Fred L. Shuttlesworth.

Emory O. Jackson (1908-1975), influential editor of the BIRMINGHAM WORLD newspaper, served that paper from 1941 until his death. Born in Georgia, Jackson was educated in Birmingham public schools and graduated from Morehouse College in Atlanta in 1932. Prior to becoming a newspaper editor, he taught school in Dothan, Alabama, as well as Jefferson County. He served as an officer in both the Alabama State Conference of chapters and the Birmingham chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP).

Judge Charles Nice (b.1919, d.-) is a native of Birmingham and was educated in Birmingham public schools. He received an undergraduate degree from the University of North Carolina Chapel Hill and a law degree from the University of Alabama. He ran for the state legislature from Birmingham in 1954 and won a seat in that body. In 1955, he cast the lone dissenting vote against legislation aimed at preserving segregation in public schools. In 1956, Nice cast the lone dissenting vote against a bill to "nullify" federal efforts to desegregate Alabama's public schools. He did not win a seat in the legislature again, but has held several judgeships in Alabama and Jefferson County. (See also BCRI Oral History Project interview with Charles Nice.)

Arthur D. Shores Papers

A native of Birmingham, Arthur Davis Shores (b.1904 – d.1996) graduated from Talladega College and received his law degree from LaSalle University in Chicago. During his career, Shores handled some of the most important civil rights and labor cases of the twentieth century. He was the third African American lawyer to practice law in the state of Alabama and was the sole African American attorney in the state for most of the 1940s. As an attorney for the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) and, later, in private practice, he

represented citizens in civil rights and labor related cases. In 1968, he became the first African American to serve on the Birmingham City Council. In addition to his political offices and appointments, Shores served on numerous state and local boards and committees throughout his life.

John L. Wright, Jr., was born on December 25, 1927, in Birmingham, Alabama. He spent his childhood in Birmingham and finished high school at St. Bernard in Cullman, Alabama and was drafted into the Army Air Corps in 1945. In 1956, he began working as assistant editor and promotions manager for *The Catholic Week*, a weekly newspaper based in Birmingham and serving the Catholic diocese of Alabama and northwest Florida. It was in this role that he met Father Eymard Galligan, who was serving as Missions Director for the Edmundite Mission in Selma, Alabama. In 1964, Galligan offered Wright a job in public and community relations at Good Samaritan Hospital in Selma. In his tenure at Good Samaritan Hospital, Wright witnessed some of the most tumultuous years in Selma's history. In 1965, Wright interviewed Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., in Selma. He also participated as an observer in the march from Selma to Montgomery and dealt with international news media regarding events there. Wright and his family returned to Birmingham in 1967 and he worked as Director of Public Relations at University Hospital until his retirement in 1989. Following retirement, Wright worked for two years at Miles College, improving relations between the college and the community. In retirement, Wright continues to pursue his lifelong passions including acting and participating in transit advocacy, believing that Birmingham has the "poorest system of a city its size in the country" largely because of continuing racial tension.
